The cohort design will help ensure that students consider their studies from multiple perspectives and critically analyze problems in search of creative and effective solutions. Students will choose personal topics to explore. This individualized experience will allow them to focus on a global topic of interest and collaborate with peers around the world.

Here are some examples of courses and experiential components of potential paths students may take. The possibilities, however, are endless! These examples are provided for illustrative purposes.

Environment: AP Environmental Science, Global Affairs, internship, summer travel to Guatemala

Community Sustainability: Human Rights, mentoring, Principles of Engineering, shadowing at a local organization

Intercultural Communication: Contemporary Civilization of Latin America, Global Literacies, Nuestro Center service work, Global Affairs, Model UN
